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Rock criticism from the beginning is a wide ranging exploration of the rise and development of rock criticism in Britain and the United States from the 1960s to the present. It chronicles the evolution of a new form of journalism and the course by which writing on rock was transformed into a respected field of cultural production. The authors explore the establishment of magazines from *Crawdaddy* and *Rolling Stone* to the *Source* and from *Melody Maker* and *New Musical Express* to *The Wire* while investigating the careers of well known music critics like Robert Christgau, Greil Marcus and Lester Bangs in the US and Nik Cohn, Paul Morley and Jon Savage in the UK to name just a few. While much has been written on the history of rock, this Bourdieu inspired book is the first to offer a look at the coming of age of rock journalism and the critics that opened up a whole new kind of discourse on popular music.

Simon Frith has been one of the most important figures in the emergence and subsequent development of popular music studies from his earliest academic publication *The Sociology of Rock* (1978) through to his recent work on the live music industry in the UK. In his desire to take popular music seriously he has probably been cited more than any other author in the field. Uniquely he has combined this work with a lengthy career as a music critic for leading publications on both sides of the Atlantic. The contributions to this volume of essays and memoirs seek to honour Frith's achievements but they are not merely about Frith; rather they are important interventions by leading scholars in the field including Robert Christgau, Antoine Hennion, Peter J. Martin and Philip Tagg. The focus on sociology and industry and aesthetics and values reflect major themes in Frith's own work.

this book takes its cue from a simple observation during the last 30 years or so the term style has all but disappeared from art critical or art historical terminology for new art history it was an increasingly problematic term associated with the taxonomist and historicist concerns of old art history not to speak of its fixation on the figure of the great artist for contemporary art criticism the term seemed simply irrelevant faced with artistic activities that challenged traditional ideas of the work of art and its relation to aesthetics itself new critical paradigms had to be invented as interventions in social reality an art of actions and events replaced preoccupations with visual style and shape the politics of social sites replaced the language of forms but while style has all but disappeared from art historical and art critical discourse artistic practice since the 1960 s onwards has seemed increasingly focused on the stylistics of the life environment the way in which everyday life itself is formed designed or stylized this development calls for a new reading of the relationship between art and the question of style one that approaches the question of style itself not just as an art historical tool or method of explanation but as a social site in which relations between appearance recognition and social identity is negotiated the question or crisis of the contemporary style site is related to the significance of stylistic issues in contemporary politics and economics that capitalizes on life itself and that is perhaps best understood through its particular production of subjectivity the works discussed in this book treat style as precisely such a site and should therefore be discussed in extension of what is generally known as site specific practices in art however the style site works radically change the notion of the politics of this type of art and may in the end also contribute to open the question of the life art practices of the avant garde to new interpretations in a blom is an associate professor at the department of philosophy classics history of art and ideas at the university of oslo she has written extensively on modern and contemporary art and is also active as an art critic
